

## **Sports for Climate Action Framework**

### **Emissions Reduction Plan**

According to the 2022-2023 emissions surveys, the majority of the Olympic Committee of Israel's emissions stem from flights taken by sports delegations, committee members, and IOC management (approximately 71% - Scope 3). The remaining emissions come from the operation of the Olympic Committee's building and museum (approximately 28% - Scope 2). Given that international competitions cannot be reached from Israel by land transport, and all flights are essential, significantly reducing emissions from these trips is not feasible. As a result, we are exploring options to offset these emissions through carefully monitored incremental projects such as tree planting and/or the installation of solar panels. Regarding operational emissions, the Olympic Committee of Israel is currently planning and constructing a new Olympic House, which will be built according to green building principles, leading to material and energy savings and a reduction in emissions associated with their production.
